Brethren:

The Scottish Rite of Freemasony for the Southern Jurisdiction has an active scholarship program for high school graduates and college students. One of these programs supports students attending Texas A&M University in College Station and is sponsored by a Texas Freemason and member of the Houston Scottish Rite.

The application process for these scholarships is currently underway and will close on April 20, 2022. There are four \$1,500 one-year scholarships available for undergraduate and graduate students who are or will be attending Texas A&M University during the 2022 academic year. Applicant criteria include being a Master Mason, Scottish Rite Mason in the Southern Jurisdiction, or child or grandchild of a Texas Master Mason or of a Master Mason who is a member of a Masonic Grand Lodge recognized by the Grand Lodge of Texas.
